

CHANGES IN SERVICES:

Search for a waste management service provider in Materiaalitori


Materiaalitori provides a handy way to search for a suitable service provider to utilise or process your waste. If you cannot find anyone, you can ask municipality to provide you with a supplementary waste management service ('TSV service') and doing so, indicate the lack of available services in a transparent manner.

A reform of the Waste Act entering into force on 1 January 2020 requires that people first search for services at the Materiaalitori website before they can request the supplementary waste management service from municipalities. The municipality provides waste management for the waste generated in households, and the municipal waste originating from service operations. The municipality also has responsibilities related to receiving and processing hazardous waste. The municipality is also responsible for providing supplementary waste management for other waste if the waste holder requests this due to a lack of private service provision and if the quality and quantity of the waste makes it suitable for transportation or processing in the municipality's waste management system.

If the value of the need for the municipality's supplementary waste management service is less than EUR 2,000 per year, the user is not required to indicate the lack of service provision through the Materiaalitori service.

Imaginary example



The workers of a small enterprise,
Drill and Hammer Ltd, are doing some
demolition work, which results in around
20 cubic metres of miscellaneous
construction waste each week. The
small company typically demolishes real
property and industrial plants and has
not been able to find a way to utilise the
construction waste through its contact
network. The company's managing director and founder, Pekka Drill, browsed the
notifications posted at Materiaalitori.fi,
but was unable to directly find a suitable
service provider on the website.

Next, Pekka registered with the Materiaalitori.fi service using his company's business ID and his personal online banking credentials, and submitted a notification of miscellaneous demolition waste. No suitable service providers still appeared. As a result, Pekka submitted a request for supplementary waste management using the service. Now, he was able to find help from the municipal sector.
